This 12-credit transcripted "Race & Social Justice Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Certificate" is designed as an area of specialization for students pursuing a bachelors degree in disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, fine arts, or the professional schools at the University of New Mexico. It is offered through a partnership between the Institute for the Study of "Race" and Social Justice and the College of Education at the University of New Mexico.

The monumental benefits of cross-disciplinary dialogues, reflection and collective insights are facilitated when faculty and students from different disciplines converge to explore the contours of race and social justice in the U.S and global context.

Who can apply?

The 12-credit transcripted "Race & Social Justice Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Certificate" is open current undergraduate students already matriculated degreegranting program (e.g. bachelors program) at the University of New Mexico, regardless of field of study or college.

Structure

Conceived as an interdisciplinary experience a total of 12-credits of undergraduate level courses will be required. A total of four courses across three different disciplines. A grade of B or better is required in these classes. No more than two classes can come from the same department. At least six credits must be upper division courses (300/400-level).
