ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

The [Latino Research Initiative](#) at The University of Texas at Austin is partnering with the [Consortium on Race, Gender, and Ethnicity](#) (CRGE) at the University of Maryland, College Park to provide advanced doctoral students a unique training opportunity at the [Intersectional Qualitative Research Methods Institute for Advanced Doctoral Students](#) (IQRMI-ADS). Few training institutes in the U.S. focus on qualitative research methods and, currently, none incorporate discussions regarding the intersections of race, gender, class, ethnicity, and other dimensions of inequity.

GOALS OF IQRMI-ADS

- Enhance qualitative research data analyses, interpretation, and analytic writing skills
- Develop critical race and intersectional perspectives for designing and interpreting research
- Provide guidance on the successful completion of the doctoral degree and transition to a postdoctoral or academic position

Through daily seminars, writing groups, and interactions with peer colleagues, IQRMI-ADS participants have the opportunity to apply their new skills to enhance the interpretation of their qualitative data analysis. Specific areas of research include:

- Advancing innovation in knowledge and practice in child welfare and juvenile justice systems
- Promoting economic, social, and educational opportunities for working families
- Creating community resources for family well-being
- Addressing disparities and inequities in health and mental health
