Dr. Xavier Medina Vidal is a scholar of Mexican American political behavior and identity, Spanish-language mass media, and the politics of México, and México-US relations. He is currently a Diane D. Blair Professor of Latino Studies and Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Arkansas where he most recently directed a national survey of Mexican attitudes regarding 2018 federal elections. He has served as invited lecturer at the National Electoral Institute (INE) of Mexico and serves on community organization boards in Arkansas.

Dr. Medina Vidal received his Ph.D. from the University of California, Riverside, and a BA and MA from UNM. He also served for two years as a fiscal analyst for New Mexico's Legislative Finance Committee.
