is Diné from Big Mountain and Kayenta, Arizona. She is a mother and licensed clinical social worker. In 2006. Amanda and four other young Native American petitioners, won their 9 vear long case to cancel the federal registrations of the NFL team, the Washington R*dsk*ns. She is an activist to spread awareness about the harmful effects of offensive Native mascots and Native cultural appropriation.



JAMES RIDING IN

is a citizen of the **Pawnee Nation, James** Riding In is the editor of Wicazo Sa Review: A **Journal of Native** American Studies. Associate Professor of American Indian Studies at Arizona State University. His scholarship also examines the effects of colonialism on the sovereignty, landholdings, human rights, health, welfare, religious freedom, and cultural integrity of Indian nations.
