Pre-meeting Workshop

On the afternoon of May 17 (1-5pm) Dr. Michelson will host a workshop on experiments in survey research. Participants at the workshop will learn about various best practices for designing, funding, and implementing survey experiments, and how to proactively avoid various potential criticisms from peer-reviewers. Participants will also learn about the pros and cons of various types of survey experiments, including exit polls, face-to-face surveys, laboratory experiments, telephone surveys, and Internet-based surveys, as well as the pros and cons of independent efforts compared to experiments conducted with community partners. Participants will learn about methods of approaching and encouraging cooperation with community partners and also how to incentivize survey participants. Participants who want individualized feedback on research proposals should send them to Dr. Michelson by Monday, May 14. In the latter part of the workshop, participants will apply their lessons learned to those proposals and contribute to group discussion of how they might be improved.


About Dr. Michelson
