This 15-credit transcripted "Race & Social Justice Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate" is designed as an area of specialization for students pursuing a master's degree or a doctorate in disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, fine arts, or the professional schools at the University of New Mexico. It is offered through the Institute for the Study of "Race" and Social Justice at the University of New Mexico.

The monumental benefits of cross-disciplinary dialogues, reflection and collective insights are facilitated when faculty and students from different disciplines converge to explore the contours of race and social justice in the U.S and global context.

Who can apply?

The 15-credit transcripted "Race & Social Justice Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate" is open to **both** current graduate students already matriculated in a graduate degree-granting program (e.g. master's or doctoral program) at the University of New Mexico, regardless of field of study and **non-UNM students** who hold an undergraduate degree.
