This appointment is a full-time position for a term of one year and funding (renewable for up to one year). The PRAs will conduct qualitative research in context, institutional dynamics, and power relations shaping the ontology of race in the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidelines and Census questions currently present. The PRAs will help co-facilitate convenings and institutes with federal administrative agencies, as well as co-author reports and publications for the Department in the College of Arts and Sciences. This research is funded by grant #79072: Employing an Intersectionality Framework in Revising Office of Management and Budget (Collecting Administrative Race and Ethnicity Data).</p>
